Acts 17 v 16; v 22 – 34

¹⁶ While Paul was waiting for them in **Athens**, he was greatly distressed to see that the city was full of idols.

²² Paul then stood up in the meeting of the Areopagus and said:
*'People of Athens! I see that in every way you are very religious. ²³ For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: **TO AN UNKNOWN GOD**. So you are ignorant of the very thing you worship – and this is what I am going to proclaim to you.*

²⁴ *'The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands. ²⁵ And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything. Rather, he himself gives everyone life and breath and everything else. ²⁶ From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. ²⁷ God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us. ²⁸ "For in him we live and move and have our being." As some of your own poets have said, "We are his offspring."*

²⁹ *'Therefore since we are God's offspring, we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone – an image made by human design and skill. ³⁰ In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent. ³¹ For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to everyone by raising him from the dead.'*

³² When they heard about the resurrection of the dead, some of them sneered, but others said, 'We want to hear you again on this subject.' ³³ At that, Paul left the Council. ³⁴ Some of the people became followers of Paul and believed. Among them was Dionysius, a member of the Areopagus, also a woman named Damaris, and a number of others.

Bible verses

Exodus 20 v 1 – 6: And God spoke all these words: 'I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God punishing the children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments.'

Luke 11 v 21, 22: When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own house, his possessions are safe. But when someone stronger attacks and overpowers him, he takes away the armour in which the man trusted and divides up his plunder.

John 1 v 29: John saw Jesus coming towards him and said, '*Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!*'

Revelation 6 v 15 – 17: Then the kings of the earth, the princes, the generals, the rich, the mighty, and everyone else, both slave and free, hid in caves and among the rocks of the mountains. They called to the mountains and the rocks, '*Fall on us and hide us from*

the face of him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb! For the great day of their wrath has come, and who can withstand it?’

Psalm 75 v 7, 8: It is God who judges: he brings one down, he exalts another. In the hand of the LORD is a cup full of foaming wine mixed with spices; he pours it out, and all the wicked of the earth drink it down to its very dregs.

1 John 4 v 10: This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice / propitiation for our sins.

Quotations

Tim Keller: *“[An idol] is anything more important to you than God, anything that absorbs your heart and imagination more than God, anything you seek to give you what only God can give.”*

Tim Keller: *“A counterfeit god is anything so central and essential to your life that, should you lose it, your life would feel hardly worth living.”*

John Stott: *“Working and waiting belong together. In combination they will deliver us both from the presumption which thinks we can do everything and from the pessimism which thinks we can do nothing”*

John Stott: “God’s wrath is neither an impersonal process of cause and effect (as some scholars have tried to argue), nor a passionate, arbitrary or vindictive outburst of temper, but his holy and uncompromising antagonism to evil, with which he refuses to negotiate. One day his judgement will fall. It is from this terrible event that Jesus is our deliverer.”

J I Packer: “In paganism, man propitiates his gods, and religion becomes a form of commercialism, and indeed, of bribery.

In Christianity, however, God propitiates his wrath by his own action:

- **he set forth** Jesus Christ, says Paul (Romans 3 v 25), to be a propitiation;
- **he sent** his Son, says John (1 John 4 v 10), to be the propitiation for our sins.”
